## Nicolas Duvernois, Founder of Pur Vodka

A born entrepreneur, Nicolas Duvernois has always been full of ideas. After his first business endeavour went sour in 2006, he decided to found Pur Vodka. Since he knew absolutely nothing about the industry, it all began with a Google search for the word "vodka." In order to finance the project, Nicolas worked as a hospital janitor by night and developed vodka by day for nearly 4 years.
